The Strongsville City Club has donated \$8,170 to the city of Strongsville to purchase two special events vehicles to be used by the Strongsville Service Department.

A resolution accepting the donation was unanimously approved by city council at a recent meeting. City council members extended their appreciation to the club for its donation.

The vehicles purchased are known as EZGo "Workhorse" vehicles. The vehicles look like a golf cart, and are designed to go off the road where cars and trucks cannot.

"These special events vehicles will be

used for events like the rib burnoff and our homecoming. These will help a great deal when we put these events on," Mayor Thomas Perciak said.

The Strongsville City Club was formed in 1968 by a group of civic leaders who established an objective to "cultivate and promote mutual and civic interests."

For 40 years, the Strongsville City Club has contributed to the community through its fundraising, capital projects, support of community activities and sponsorship of the Special Olympics.

The club is best known for its annual Rib Burnoff and the Breakfast on the Covered Bridge.
