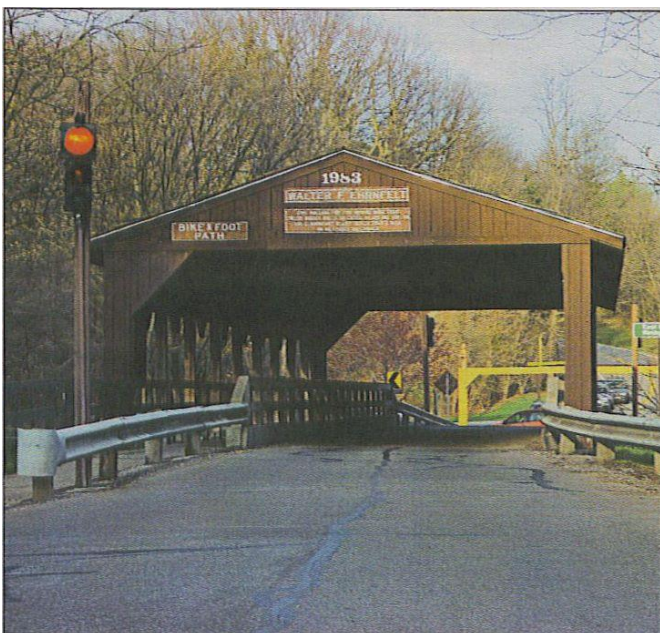

The Strongsville City Club is best known for its annual Rib Burn Off, slated for June 24 to 26 at Strongsville Commons, located at the corner of Royalton and Pearl roads, and the Breakfast on the Bridge, located at the Strongsville Metroparks on the corner of Whitney Road and Valley Parkway, scheduled for Sept. 19.
