Elaine Peskar, a Strongsville resident since 1976, was recently chosen as Newburgh's Slovenian Woman of the Year for the Slovenian National Home on East 80th Street.

Elaine has been very active in the Slovenian community, as well as the local community. She has helped with the Strongsville Historical Society Car Show and other historical society events, she

has prepared meals for the Strongsville High School football coaches during the preseason and playoffs, and she has assisted her husband, Tony, with many responsibilities in local groups. He says that when she helps, it is always with a caring smile on her face.

Elaine grew up in Garfield Heights with her parents, Marion (Magalski) and Walter Michalik. She is the eldest of four children, which include her sister, Linda (Weber), who lives in Parma, and her two brothers, Craig and Ken, who both live in Michigan.
